lease note that there will be a new section on the web site titled "CWS's only". It will be a section guarded by a password so that only CWS's may enter. You will need to enter your last name as the user name and your CWS® ID number as the password.

This area of the web site will be broken into two sections. One will be to review the new draft of the bylaws (see article in this issue). We will have the old version next to the new version so you will be able to view the proposed changes. Also, the Board of Directors will be asking for any feedback regarding the proposed changes that will be posted.

The second section will be for submission of exam questions to be used for the National Board Certification Examination for Wound Management Professionals. There will be a template set up so that you will be able to type in your question, four possible answers, and an area to note the correct answer and the reference material for the guestion. These questions will be submitted to the Exam Committee for review to be used on an upcoming exam.

Director's AAWM to Become Predominant Authoritative Body in Wound Care Field

i to all! Hoping this Holiday season finds you healthy and having fun! I am writing to update you on the progress we are making towards making the AAWM the predominant authoritative body in the field of wound care.

Interest in our certification has grown by leaps and bounds. A record number of candidates sat for the October, 2002 examination-actually a 31 percent increase over any other time the test has been given. Over 3,500 additional individuals have requested information about the CWS® credential and have indicated potential interest in taking the exam.

Feedback from these people indicates that many potential candidates are uncomfortable attempting to pass the CWS® exam without a formal preparatory course. Therefore, in response to this overwhelming demand, our Board has authorized the formation of a subsidiary corporation-the Institute for the Advancement of Wound Management

(IAWM)-whose sole purpose is to raise funds for AAWM, principally through educational activities. According to its draft mission statement the IAWM will "strive to provide individual and public education regarding wound care principles and practices, treatments, products and reimbursement issues. The funds generated through these educational activities will be used to promote the value of the Certified Wound Specialist® credential to existing and potential AAWM candidates, health care employers, insurance companies, governmental agencies, patients and the general public." Initial educational activities will include:

- Creation of a preparatory course for candidates who are studying to take the CWS® examination.
- Preparation of "position papers" reviewing wound care treatments and technologies.
- Reviewing the policies of insurance carriers who wish to understand which therapies should be reimbursed.
