Examination Results for 2003

In 2003, 399 candidates sat for the Board Certification Examination in Wound Management. Of those candidates, 242 or 61% were certified. This pass rate is consistent with the 61% average pass rate for the examination since October 1999.

Of those passing the examination in 2003: .5% were Research Associates: 46.3% were Clinical Associates; 23.5% were Fellows; and 29.7% were Diplomates.

The 2003 exam saw an increase of 23% more applicants sitting for the exam versus the number of candidates who took the exam in 2002. The number of candidates for both 2004 exams is also expected to increase.

¶ ll Certified Wound Specialists are required to recertify every ten years. The first group A of individuals up for recertification was certified in July 1995 and expires in July 2005.

The recertification process applies to all CWSs. This includes both those individuals who were grandfathered using the portfolio method and those who sat for the actual exam.

The Recertification Committee is currently finalizing the recertification process and will present the guidelines and procedures to CWSs this summer.

Best Promoter of CWS® Certification is You!

As the certification credential continues to grow, AAWM continues its marketing goals of exhibiting at national and regional meetings as well as advertising in industry publications. However, the best promotion of the certification is through word of mouth. How can you help spread the word about the Certified Wound Specialist® designation?

- Wear your CWS® lapel pin on your lab coat or work clothing;
- Always include the CWS® credential after your name (especially anywhere your name is in print);
- Promote the exam when you teach at local and national wound care courses. (Contact AAWM and we will provide you with information materials that you can give to your students.); and
- Encourage your wound care team or colleagues to become board certified.

Exam Question Challenge

The American Academy of Wound Management is challenging all CWSs to write at least one question for the Exam Committee for potential submission to the Board Certification Examination for Wound Management Professionals.

Some guidelines for writing questions:

- 1. They must be multiple choice format
- 2. They must have four possible answers (with the correct answer identified)
- 3. They must have a referenced source with each question
- 4. They should be designed for participants to recall, understand, apply or evaluate AAWM is also looking to include case studies with photographs for future examinations. When submitting a photograph/digital image, the same question guidelines above apply, as well as the following for photographs:
- 1. Photographs/digital images may be in either color or black/white (no Polaroids)
- 2. If using a digital camera, a high resolution setting produces quality images
- 3. The area of interest should be clear and easily identifiable
- 4. Patient privacy must be respected, no names or identifying information may be visible
- 5. If possible, a ruler (in cm or mm for scale purposes) should be visible in the photograph

Please remember that all case studies and photographs/digital images become the property of the AAWM for use as determined by the AAWM. Revocation Process

Tach year AAWM sends notices to CWSs that have not re-registered for the current year. Re-registration notices generally will be sent in the following order:

- 1) Initial notice sent one month prior to due date
- 2) Second notice sent one month later
- 3) Third notice sent one month after that
- 4) Warning letter sent when re-registration is three months past due
- 5) Revocation letter sent one month after warning letter

If you receive a revocation notice, it is likely to be the **fifth** communication we have sent to your office or home regarding your renewal. If you do not open your mail, please educate your staff on the re-registration process. It is your sole responsibility to keep AAWM informed of any address changes, and to open your mail.

Also, please note that AAWM sends these notices to its certificants purely as a courtesy. YOU MAY NOT RELY ON RECEIVING ANY NOTICES AND YOU ARE SOLELY RESPONSIBLE FOR YOUR RE-REGISTRATION WHETHER OR NOT YOU RECEIVE ANY NOTICE.
