AAWM Opens Exam to Canadians

n March, the AAWM Board approved a motion to open the CWS® examination to wound care professionals from Canada. The opening of the exam to Canadians was in response to the large requests the AAWM gets each exam period from individuals outside of the United



States (previously the exam was restricted only to citizens of the United States and its territories). October 16, 2004

will be the first exam open to Canadians. Depending on the response from October candidates, AAWM may look to open the exam to other countries in the coming years.

s I attempt to write these words, I cannot help but flash back to the day the idea for the Academy was born. On that day in 1995, a vas-

cular surgeon, two non-ET wound care nurses, another podiatrist and I were engaged in a discussion where we all, ultimately, ended up defining ourselves as wound care experts. Yet, brilliantly, we deduced that although all of us had a valuable role to play in the care of a patient's wound, not one of us had been held to any standard or requisite body of knowledge that would allow ourselves to be called "specialists" in this area. Dr. John Nelson, current AAWM Secretary/ Treasurer, Dr. John Prior and I decided at that moment that it really wasn't a question of why or how a certification process would be established, but when.

The task of developing a credible process that fairly examined a core body of knowledge across the basic medical sciences and amongst multiple disciplines required of a "complete" wound care practitioner was daunting. And it was only accomplished because of the commitment of the earliest boards to quality and the maintenance of a high standard in the test development and examination process. The result is a highly sought after, meaningful, interdisciplinary credential.

At the last meeting of the board, I was extremely edified by the quality of the individuals and their voluntary dedication to furthering the mission of the Academy. Job Analysis Survey

hank you to those CWSs that participated in the Job Analysis Survey in July. The survey is a study of the job tasks that are performed by those in the profession. The survey listed 142 tasks that may be performed at some time by a professional in the wound management field. The survey was sent to over 4,000 CWSs and other wound care professionals.

AAWM will take the responses from this survey and produce a Job Analysis Report. This report will verify the validity of the exam and insure that our current exam is testing the right information of our candidates.

AAWM Annual Business Meeting Minutes

- I. Call to Order President Chuck Gokoo called the meeting to order at 6:01 pm.
- II. Roll Call of Certified Wound Specialists Roll was checked upon arrival and attendees were given the agenda at that time.

III. Acknowledgements

Dr. Chuck Gokoo introduced the members of the Board of Directors that were present. Recognition was given to CWS® Gayle Lindsey for her role as Regional Committee Chair and acknowledging her work at the booth during the SAWC meeting.

IV. Bylaws Amendment Vote

A vote was called to accept the proposed bylaws revisions for AAWM. The proposed changes were APPROVED with six opposed (one in person, five via mail ballot).

V. Old Business

Attendees were informed of the Board's decision to open the CWS®

examination to Canadian candidates starting in October 2004.

VI. New Business

The issue of recertification was raised. Joe McCulloch outlined the proposed recertification process (a self-assessment examination) to the attendees.

There was also a brief discussion about whether the AAWM would develop a review course for its examination and if another entity would need to be formed to administer such a program. Gokoo informed the attendees that a committee of the board was currently researching this idea.

VII. Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned at 6:45 pm.
